
- Learn real-life techniques such as suturing, setting a splint, wound care, taking vital signs and perform simulated clinical rounds
- Visit a simulation lab where medical and healthcare professors help students refine their life-saving skills
- Work in teams as you research, diagnose, and develop a treatment plan for a patient
- Take part in a mass casualty simulation, experiencing firsthand how to react in an emergency
- Up-close look at ambulance and speak with EMTs and paramedics on what it's like to be on the front line

Academic Program Overview

In the first week, students will learn how to take vital signs and perform CPR. They will also work on key wilderness medicine techniques and visit a simulation lab where med students and faculty are trained and evaluated. In the second week, students put their skills to the test in a mass casualty incident simulation during which students triage and stabilize victims. By using an experiential learning approach, students will quickly engage in these topics, and the instructor introduces the underlying theory and concepts as students tackle issues while working to support, diagnose, and save their patients.

All students visit a simulation center for hands-on practice in stitching, suturing, intubation, and BLS skills led by leading medical trainers. Past visits have included the Yale Center for Medical Simulation, the UCSF Kanbar Simulation Center, Icahn School of Medicine Simulation Center in NY, STRATUS Center (affiliated with Harvard Medical School), UC San Diego's SIM Center, the CDC Museum, and Georgia's Cobb County Training Unit. Visits provide first-hand observations of the high-pressure/ life-saving world of an emergency room.
