ACADEMIC PROGRAM OVERVIEW:

In the first week, students will learn how to take vital signs, suture, and perform CPR. They will also work on key wilderness medicine techniques and learn how to splint, apply a tourniquet and settle a patient. In the second week, students put their skills to the test by diagnosing patients in case studies, using knowledge and skills learned in the first week of the program.
