Residential Students

Commuter Students

Student Life

Students live and study on one of the most green urban campuses in the U.S. This campus is known for its blend of modern facilities, historic buildings, and innovation in their public spaces. Surrounded by nature, but in the heart of the city, students have the best of both worlds. Students enjoy their free time by exploring both the communal indoor and outdoor spaces and the diverse array of restaurants, shops, cafes, and dessert spots around the school. There are numerous fields and open areas students can hang out and play games, including popular sand volleyball courts.



Lodging and Meals

Students will be housed Woodruff South, which includes in-suite style air-conditioned rooms on gender-segregated floors. All rooms include an extra-long twin sized bed, a desk and chair, wardrobe, and dresser. Bathrooms are in-suite and are typically shared amongst four students. Mentors live on same floors as students and available for any needs. Woodruff is a great dorm for Summer Springboard as it's located across from a sand volleyball court, close to the dining hall, central on campus, and a 15 minute walk to classes. Woodruff has free laundry facilities, vending machines, a courtyard, and common lounge areas making it a comfortable place to hang out. Students will have their daily three meals in either the dining hall, Student Union, or off campus.
