Dr. Laur Rubino holds a Ph.D. from the University of Cincinnati's School of Criminal Justice and earned their M.S. and B.S. in criminal justice, along with a B.A. in psychology from Wayne State University. Their research, spanning the last decade, focuses on issues within the criminal/juvenile legal system, voting rights, wrongful convictions, and the intersection of identities. As a part-time professor at Wayne State University, they teach courses on Gender and Crime, Domestic Violence, and LGBTQ+ Topics in Criminal Justice, while also leading Their Research, a consulting agency, and co-founding Voting Rights Now (VRN) to champion voting rights for those in the criminal legal system.

- Price: \$3,198


#### Supplements:
