#### **ACADEMIC PROGRAM OVERVIEW:**



#### Instructor - Dr. Zina Besirevic

Dr. Zina Besirevic is a researcher, psychologist and an educator with a breadth of experience spanning many countries and high impact institutions. She earned her Ph.D. in Cognition and Development from UC Berkeley, specializing in the study of emotions, effect of trauma on development, and moral reasoning. Her work has been particularly focused on studying how young people think about justice and human rights. She also holds Masters degrees in Ed. Psychology, and Moral Philosophy. Zina has received multiple awards including: Fellow of the U.S. Congress Institute for Peace and a recipient of their prominent Peace Scholar Award, Minerva Award from the U.S. Department of Defense, and Jean Piaget Society Prize for innovative psychology research. At UC Berkeley, Zina taught psychology and education courses and was elected Chancellor's Public Scholar, in recognition of the impact of her community engaged scholarship. Her work spans many countries and has been published multiple times. Currently, Zina leads youth-focused research programs for the San Francisco Mayor's Office and heads a consultancy for psychological research and practice.

#### **TUITION SUPPLEMENTS:**
