NEUROSCIENCE

Keisha Winston is a Professor of Neuroscience, Psychology and Biology. 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Program Types & Tuition

Residential



Also known as the Hogwarts of the US, our residential students will spend two weeks living in one of Yale's iconic fourteen residence halls where they will also experience Yale's award-winning dining. - Students will participate in a crime scene simulation.

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TRIAL LAW

<u>Highlights</u>

- Assume the role of trial attorney as you try a challenging case by researching evidence, preparing and crafting arguments, and preparing and examining witnesses.
- Experience a unique view of the legal profession that is personal and insightful from seasoned lawyers or legal scholars.
- Explore all roles of a challenging case acting as defense attorneys, prosecutors, witnesses, jurors, or judge.
- Visit a courthouse and sit in on an active trial.

Real World Insights

Spend time with a judge, attorneys, and other legal experts. This is a rare opportunity to sit in a courtroom, ask personal questions, and hear professionals discuss their journeys from law school to where they are today. Past students got the opportunity to visit the New Haven Superior Court.

EMERGENCY MEDICINE

<u>Highlights</u>

- Discover practical skills such as suturing, stopping a bleed and taking vital signs.
- Gain valuable insight into diverse educational and career opportunities in medicine and healthcare.
- Participate in a "mass casualty incident" where you work against the clock to save as many people as possible.
- Train in a medical simulation lab where medical students refine their life-saving skills, such as intubation and CPR.

Real World Insights

If your vision of your future self includes a white coat and stethoscope, scrubs and a heart monitor, the best way to launch a career in emergency medicine is to gain practical, hands-on life saving skills. Students in the past received a behind the scenes tour of Yale New Haven Emergency Department, which has educational, preventive and outreach programs designed to understand, treat and prevent the most serious of patient injuries.

- Understand treatment strategies for a variety of mental health issues that affect millions of individuals.
- Interact with clinical psychologists, neurologists and researchers who are experts in this specialized field.
- Learn how to construct a novel psychological theory and design experiments to test it.
- Discover what psychology is like as a profession, as an academic or clinician.

Real World Insights

Nothing is more fascinating and mysterious to us than each other. Through hands-on psychology and neuroscience simulations, you will connect with professionals and explore the relationships between the brain and human behavior. Past students visited the Cushing Center at Yale, named after one of the most important names in neurosurgery.
